Dear Friends,

We live in a very volatile times these days, where things can change on a daily basis. And each one of us needs to adapt to this ever-changing world for us to survive. Although the UK government set up the rule-of-six, this doesn't apply to church services, which can still gather up to 30 people. So our weekly Holy Communion Service every Wednesday and Friday at 8:30am and 1:15pm, respectively, will still be continuing. In fact, we also started live-streaming the Friday service through our <u>Facebook</u> account. This service can also be viewed afterwards on our <u>Twitter</u> and <u>YouTube</u> channels.

We urge everyone to stay home and not to travel unless absolutely necessary to further help stop the spread of this virus and avoid having a second peak like that happening now in other countries. Please be sensible and follow the government's guidelines on doing social distancing when in public and of wearing mask. We also urge everyone to pray for all our brave frontline workers (the doctors, nurses, hospital staff, drivers, grocers, pharmacists, police officers, etc) who are constantly risking their lives every day just to be able to help us survive this pandemic. Please also remember in your prayers those affected by the pandemic, especially those who are bereaved. We pray for everyone to stay calm, well and safe and to find comfort that God will lead us through this.

Opening Times for the church

Our church will still remain open for personal prayers only from Monday to Friday 2-4pm and during Holy Communion Service on Wednesdays 8:15-9:00am and on Fridays 1:00-2:00pm. The church office will remain on a per appointment basis only between 11.30am and 5pm. Please contact <u>Katrina</u> or <u>Arnel</u> if you want to book an appointment with them.

Other churches are open at different times across the City, please check their notice boards/website for details.

St Vedast Courtyard is also available for prayer all day Monday to Friday.

To keep our church Covid-safe, we ask everyone visiting us to follow this procedure which you'll find in our <u>website</u>.
